12:00 -VFW Flag Raising-Jerry Neeman

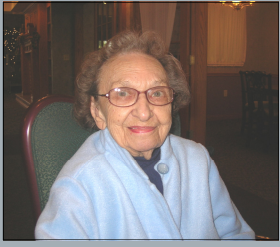
