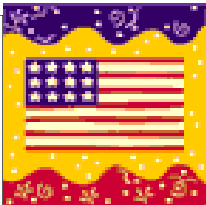


WELCOME.... EVELYN RYBIN

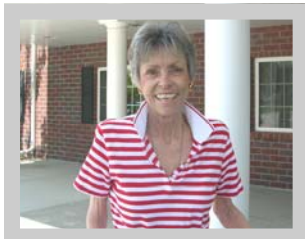
